### 71/20 DC FORMAN

DC Forman reported:

- Covid cases in the North were 394 per 100k and in the South 160 per 100k so there was a large difference between the 2 sectors of the county.
- SDC had given the following grant funding
  - Business grants £3.3 million to 2989 businesses
  - Rates grants £1.65 million to 316
  - £623k+ to eligible residents in receipt of council tax benefits
- SDC had paid out more than the £4 million received from central government so had formed a Council Recovery Advisory Group who would need to make some difficult decisions when looking at the budget
- $\circ$   $\,$  SDC was working with WCC to save money by working in unison for some contracts  $\,$
- $_{\odot}$  Stratford was the 4  $^{\rm th}$  worst economically affected area with an estimated £500 million in lost revenue from 7 million visitors
- Alcester TC and SDC to take over the Grieg Centre
- Currently in consultation:
  - Site Allocation Plan
  - Gypsy & Traveller Plan

As there was no electricity available a budget for up to  $\pm 200$  for solar lights was approved but Cllr Stanton would also put out a request for donations.

- vii. Ford
  - Diseased Trees

Proposal for 3 trees which were deemed to be unsafe to be removed entirely & the remaining trees to be reduced by 30% to bring them down to a safer, more manageable height. It was noted that the Clerk had tried to get 2 other quotes but had no response. Due to the urgency of this it was agreed to accept the one quotation received for  $\pounds1250$ .

# Proposed Cllr Stiley Seconded Cllr Lewington 4 Cllrs in favour and 1 against Replacement of Trees

Cllr Stiley recommended the purchase of 4 London Plane trees at a cost of  $\pm 150 \pm 180$  each. This variety was tall and strong and would provide a good canopy.

The clerk advised that there were grants available for tree planting so it was agreed that these would be researched/applied for first as the cost for removing the trees in the first place had not been budgeted for.

Cllr Lewington reported that there was a lot of debris in the Ford which Cllr Stiley agreed to look into removing.
