10th November, Extraordinary Meeting—School Parking Issues

Following this meeting a letter was sent to all residents of Coughton and also the parents/carers of children from the school. This was asking for tolerance and to adhere to the parking restrictions in the lane but mostly no abuse on either part. This in the main has been working, with the odd car still not moving over or parking where they are required not to. Once the school is notified these vehicles are being moved.
