

Alcester Police SNTs. Latest Weekly Report. Sunday 2nd July 2023

Based at Alcester Police Station, The Safer Neighbourhood team's primary roles are around crime prevention, problem solving both long standing or emerging issues of community concern and community engagement. We are supported at Alcester by colleagues from Patrol teams whose role is to respond to incidents and investigate crimes that occur in the area 24/7. The SNT is supervised by Inspector Hembry who leads on Neighbourhood Policing for Stratford District and Sqt Ebbs who also oversees neighbourhood Policing in the Shipston on Stour area. Alcester SNT currently consists of 2 Police officers and 5 Police Community Support Officers, and our contact details are shown above.

VEHICLE NUMBER PLATE SECURITY



How to protect your plates

- Use a garage at night if you can
- Park in busy, well-lit areas if you have to park on the street
 - Use safe, well-lit public car parks
- Consider using security screws which can be turned easily using a screwdriver to fit them but cannot be undone using normal tools.
- Consider using theft-resistant number plates which may cost a little more but are designed to resist known attack methods and will break apart if someone tries to remove them by force.

- If your plates are stolen, replace them with a new design so they are different to the lost ones as soon as possible.
 - Report all suspicious behaviour
