A Message from Revd. Dr. Julian

Dear Friends,

Over these last few months of lockdown I have been reading for the first time the letters that I sent home from Bangladesh when I worked there as a missionary doctor in the 1970's . The letters are very detailed and I am quite amazed at what we managed to achieve in that very remote hospital without electricity or even running water! I was fascinated with my description of Easter there in that tiny Christian village , miles from the nearest town .

Good Friday began by driving a little nine year old boy ith an intestinal obstruction a hundred and twenty miles north to a better equipped hospital, along mud roads and across wide rivers. Despite the five and a half hour journey the little chaps condition improved and I was able to leave him in more experienced hands, returning to our thirty six- bedded hospital the following day .

"Easter morning started early in Bollobphur. At 4:30 am groups of singers with drums and cymbals began their processions around the villages. Three times they passed by the mission house before dawn. Then at dawn everyone was up and the singing of Easter hymns began at the village cemetery, where all the family graves had been tidied and scrubbed and all the families stood around the graves with candles and flowers. The church was full of happy and excited villagers for the communion service at 7:00 am. Then we had a boiled egg for breakfast, (a great treat!) followed by a quiet ward round, made even more memorable because there were no chickens to chase out."

As I look back on those years as a young doctor in that very remote hospital, where every day was full of new experiences and new challenges, I'm inspired all over again by the sheer vibrancy of the villagers who had so little in the way of security and material possessions, and yet celebrated Easter with such excitement and happiness.

Throughout the world this month tens of millions of Christian people will again be celebrating Easter, thanking God for the Resurrection of His Son Jesus Christ, and we too will be celebrating with them "Jesus risen from the grave"! This has been the message of the church for 2000 years.

To all of us the Resurrection of Jesus means a new life and a new beginning, a reassurance that he is alive and his presence can be experienced by those who put their trust in him.

"Alleluia - Christ is risen! He is risen indeed!"

May each one of us, like tens of millions of Christians across the world, share the joy of meeting with the risen Lord Jesus this Easter .

Dear Church member

Easter is a special time of the year and many choose to attend church to celebrate the festival. This year, we are permitted to hold services at our churches and the good news is that almost all our churches will be offering a service on Easter Sunday.

We want to welcome you to services in the Minster Churches, but for everyone's safety we have established some COVID rules.

- It is mandatory to wear a form of face covering, unless you are exempt.
- We require you to maintain a 2 metre social distance at all times. For this reason the number attending our churches are limited. Therefore.....
- You MUST reserve a place through the Administrator if you wish to attend a service at any of the Minster Churches.
- Those who are at extra risk and the 'clinically extremely vulnerable' are advised to refrain from attending public worship at the moment as the risk is still high, however the decision to attend is in your hands.
- Your details will be held to enable a seat to be booked and for track and trace purposes. Any information gathered in this respect will be destroyed after 21 days.
- Singing is still not permitted.

In order to avoid disappointment, please reserve your place in advance of the Sunday Service, preferably by noon on the Friday prior to the service, when the list of reservations is sent to the Churchwarden[s]. This enables them to have a list of who to expect to attend the service.

You can reserve a place by emailing <u>administrator@alcesterminster.org</u> or by telephone either 0784 028 4294 or 01789 763 246.

If you are able, you can view the weekly on-line Sunday service by going to the website: www.alcesterminster.org. The service is located on the front page of the website. If the service is not immediately visible, just scroll down the page. You do not need to subscribe to any website such as Zoom or YouTube. The service is recorded and can be viewed at any point during the week.

The Church Coping With The Pandemic

As we approach the end of restrictions following the Covid pandemic, and some sort of normal life returns, it seemed appropriate to keep everyone up to date with how Church life has coped. The Link Parish Magazine has not been printed and distributed since March last year and it may be a few months before we are able to do so. The Government considered there was a risk of spreading the disease with the handling of printed matter and the Church of England reacted accordingly. As a result the Editor produced an electronic version of the Link each month using local Facebook Groups and websites to maintain its circulation.

Although Risk Assessments were made at both St Peter's and Sambourne Church it was decided that regular services were too risky although both churches were open at times for private prayer. With the closing of churches the advent of on-line services were borne and the Alcester Minster produced such a service each Sunday and other special days.

Reduced services meant reduced collections, the closing of Coughton Court removed visitors donations at St Peter's and with the restrictions on gatherings no fund raising events were possible. All important sources of income to the Church. However, with the help of the 100 Club Members, who maintained their contributions throughout the duration, and general donations from many sources, both by people connected with the Church and other well-wishers, the P.C.C. showed a deficit of only £167 for 2020. This was after a contribution was made to the Children's Society of £300, as it was not possible to hold the annual Christingle service at St Peter's, and £250 to the Birmingham Children's Hospital.

As many parishioners will know the P.C.C. has wanted to redecorate St Peter's Church internally for many years but it has not been possible for cost reasons. With the dawning of possibly a new era and as it has not been carried out for over 50 years, it has been decided to have the redecoration started before the end of the year with funds collected specially for the

purpose and with a grant of £4,000 (we hope) from Charitable sources this may now be possible. Sambourne Church Hall also requires re-decoration and the lighting upgraded. This will be funded from reserves and with a donation made from Molly Loach`s family in her memory.

We now have a new Rector to replace Adrian and Katie Cross is moving up from Exeter to take on the role. Initially she will work remotely from home until she moves, with her family, to Alcester later in April. With restrictions slowly lifting it is hoped to resume regular Church Services at both Coughton and Sambourne as soon as possible .Until we meet again stay safe and well.

Studley Isolation Support Group **update**May 2020 Edition 2

Now, more than ever, the community in our village are pulling together to support each other. The Studley Isolation Support Group supports all those who are isolated, alone, elderly or vulnerable. With Studley in Business and the Parish Council, we have built a core team of around 50 volunteers who carry out tasks on a daily basis. So far we have supported 165 households and undertaken over 1000 tasks. These range fromshopping, prescription collection to dog walking and daily newspaper deliveries.

Nothing is too much trouble for our volunteers, and we actively encourage anyone who is having to isolate, with no close family close by to help them, to give us a call on 07933 093268 from 9am to 5pm Monday to Saturday.

If you have a neighbour you are concerned about then please ask them to call us. Our aim is for everyone who is vulnerable to stay safely at home. No one who should be isolating needs to do any shopping, our volunteers are shopping ninjas!

We will be here for as long as necessary, and alongside our day to day tasks we can arrange for someone to call you for a chat, drop off some books or jigsaws, post letters etc. We are here for you.

Please note that we operate a password system to protect you. Please do not open the door to anyone you don't know, unless they can tell you the password that YOU have chosen. There are scammers capitalising on the current situation, and we want everyone to stay safe. Always follow the Government's Social Distancing guidelines

We are still looking for volunteers, please contact us if you are willing to help...

Many volunteers are busy sewing scrubs, bags, headbands and facemasks. They are in need of new material (that can be washed at 60 deg), elastic & buttons about the size of a 2p. If you can help then please call the Isolation Support Group on 07933 093268.

Arden Foodbank is working hard to supply food parcels to our community. Anyone who is struggling can request a voucher. Parcels can be collected from the Methodist Church on Tuesday afternoons, or one of the Isolation Support Group Volunteers can collect and deliver it for you. Nature jottings from Perrymill Lane

This has been the month when the transition from winter to spring has become apparent to bring us much cheer from the gloom of the pandemic.



21st Feb. Several Song Thrushes were singing and were audible from Perrymill Lane almost to Coughton along Wike Lane. A field off Wike Lane had 30+ Greylag and Canada Geese grazing. Adam mentioned having seen a Kingfisher by the brook below the end of Perrymill Lane – the first he's seen there since he was a boy (only yesterday!)

22nd Feb. In Coughton Lane, at the start of the drive to Coughton Lodge Farm, we spotted a flock of around six Yellowhammers, and a Cormorant was perched in a tree near the farmhouse.

23rd Feb. Justin mentioned having seen four Little Egrets in a field off Sambourne Lane. Frances later reported the same.

24th Feb. Celandines are adding some colour to the verges in Wike Lane.

25th Feb. A mixed flock of Siskins and Redpolls were feeding in birch trees in Wike Lane. A flock of Fieldfares and Redwings were feeding in a field off Coughton Lane, Coughton.

4th March. After a lengthy absence from our garden, Greenfinches and Goldfinches, three of each, have visited the sunflower seed feeders today.

 7^{th} March. As I pottered in the garden my attention was attracted by the mewing call of a Buzzard. Five were circling overhead at a variety of altitudes – one quite low and the highest hardly visible.

 8^{th} March. A Kestrel was perched in a tree at the Alcester Heath end of Coughton Lane.

9th March. Pussy willow is now becoming apparent in the hedgerows.



 $13^{\rm th}$ March. More Greenfinches and Goldfinches were visiting the garden feeders and a Great Spotted Woodpecker visited the peanuts.

14th March. In Wike Lane Sue heard the first Chiffchaff of the spring, but unfortunately my inferior hearing couldn't pick it up. A

Muntjac crossed the road in front of us. We watched a Skylark preforming its song flight by Coughton Lane.

 15^{th} March. Blackthorn is now coming into blossom in the hedgerows.

16th March. Although still not audible to me, Sue could hear more Chiffchaff singing beyond the ford at Coughton.

17th March. Having presumably been temporarily woken from hibernation, a Peacock butterfly has now settled in a very vulnerable location by our utility room door.

 18^{th} March. Eight Lapwings were feeding in a field off Coughton Lane.

These birds are no longer a common sight around us having suffered a significant decline in numbers. Pussy willow is now starting to develop it's lovely yellow display of pollen. A brief spell of sunshine this afternoon raised the temperature a little and resulted in the



welcome sight of a pristine Brimstone butterfly in our garden.




