CC Justin Kerridge commented, if you see any problems in the area please report them on the Stratford District Council website, where there is a 'REPORT IT' function.

We were updated re possible merger between WCC and SDC. At the garden meeting we had kindly been gifted a derelict barn for erection and use as a village hall. It was decided that a 'group' needed to be set up to discuss all the options this entails, i.e. purchase of land, application for grants etc. Alex suggested a possible position for this which will be considered in due course.
