Parish Council Meeting 28th November 2022

This evenings Parish Council meeting was attended by 2 members of public. One introduced himself as newly moved to the village and told us his future intentions for his property. We were joined by CC Justin Kerridge who spoke of the situation regarding the path from Coughton to Studley and the cost of approx. 96k to repair this. The potholes in Coughton Lane were reported and are being repaired on 22nd and 23rd December with a road closure in place. The jetting of the blocked drains in Sambourne/Coughton & Coughton Fields Lanes is on the list to do but the PC have been informed this would also require traffic lights, which will cause congestion. The headmaster of Coughton CofE School informed us that one of his teachers had received a 'silver award' for teacher of the year, which is wonderful news. The £100 raised from the sale of the calendars has been put towards the village Christmas tree along with £50 from the Parish Council Chairman's fund. The budget review was deferred until January when we also discuss the precept. The ford group name will be changed to the Environmental Group to incorporate pathways and rights of way work

Chair of the Parish Council Roy Piddington, laid a wreath on Remembrance Sunday at the cross on the A435, to remember all who have been lost in conflict, both human and animals alike.
